1. Select the *Image* file to upload.
2. Enter the *Alternative Text* for use with screen readers.
3. Select your image *Alignment* and *Border* and enter your image *Width* and *Height*.
4. Select *Keep image proportions* to resize the image clearly.
5. Select *Save*.
